Report on the Parish Council Meeting

At a meeting of the St Keverne Parish Council on Thursday 5th February the Community Against Dean Super Quarry presented a petition opposing the erection of buildings and fencing on the Dean Quarry Site. During the brief time for public comments members of the Committee Against Dean Super Quarry outlined our objections to the reinstatement of the quarry both in terms of inadequate access, adverse environmental impact of the proposed fencing, lack of clarity on footpath management and environmental damage re naturalisation of the site.

There were other comments from the public regarding the number of vehicles accessing the site and the potential adverse impact of the project on the clarity of water in respect of an local expanding sea salt business.

The strongest argument that the quarry had been abandoned and hence the existing permissions needed re-evaluation was quashed on advice from the country planning officer who informed the meeting that there had been a successful extension of this clause last until Oct 2015. This was new information to council and members expressed concern that they had not been notified of this application for extension.

The councillors discussed the application and disappointingly some members were not persuaded by the strength of public opinion. A vote to reject the proposal was not taken and instead an amendment requesting further environmental information was passed so deferring a decision. It is the CADS view that this will not be in time to be considered by the County Council Planning Department in reviewing the application. However all individual objections and the objectors petition bearing 1800 signatories will be presented. Further information will be available on the parish council website in the published minutes.
